## Mid-Year Academic Performance Report

Kairos Learning Solutions serves students in Salinas, CA using the 2 Hour Learning/APEX model — a personalized, AI-driven microschool approach. Our cohort of 10 students is measured using the same MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) assessment used by public schools nationwide. Results below reflect mid-year 2025-2026 data.

### Growth Percentiles: Kairos vs. National Norms

MAP growth percentiles show how much students **grew** compared to peers nationally. Above 50th = above average growth.
